What is a training Clinic?

This day long training session is tailored to meet the needs of students in Secondary School training for the Ethics Olympiad. The day will involve an intensive in-serve in theoretical and applied ethics. Eth-letes (Students) will be exposed to specialists and experienced Olympiad judges. During the day eth-letes will also participate in an Ethics Olympiad heat. This clinic will be held online using Zoom. All participants will need their own device to access zoom..
